



**Mia Russell** is the Executive Assistant at the Japanese American National Museum in Los Angeles. Russell also manages the Japanese American Confinement Sites Consortium, a nationwide coalition of preservation, education, and advocacy organizations working to elevate the history and social justice lessons of the WWII experience of Japanese Americans.



She previously served for five years as the Executive Director of the Friends of Minidoka, the Idaho-based nonprofit organization dedicated to preserving the Minidoka Japanese American incarceration site.

Russell earned a B.A. in the humanities from Soka University of America and an M.A. in Applied Historical Research from Boise State University. For her graduate thesis, she developed Minidoka NHS, a walking tour mobile app for Minidoka National Historic Site.

She is a co-author of *Minidoka National Historic Site* (Images of America). She previously served as Vice President of the Boise Valley Chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League.

Mia is passionate about the preservation of the WWII Japanese American confinement sites and collaborative community organizing.
